#### Academic Advising at SOAR -

#### When will I see the changes to my class schedule that I discussed with an advisor at SOAR?

Beginning mid-June, our Advising Team will address course conflicts. Changes are not instantaneous, however, and may take multiple weeks to finalize. Please be patient and check your RavenZone account during the summer months for your updated course schedule.

#### I am a parent. May I attend my student's meeting with an advisor?

The purpose of this meeting is for the student to establish a connection with a faculty advisor in a one-on-one setting. If there are specific concerns you would like to have addressed in the meeting, please discuss them with your student and have him or her be prepared beforehand.



#### Calculus I Placement Exam

#### What is the Calculus I Placement Exam?

The Calculus I placement exam is an online assessment used to determine if a student is prepared to take Calculus I (MATH-1300) at Benedictine College.

#### Who is required to take the Calculus I Placement Exam?

The exam is required for any student who needs to take Calculus I at Benedictine for their degree plan but has not earned a grade of 'C' or better in a Pre-Calculus (MATH-1250) or transferred equivalent.

#### What if I have taken the AP Pre-Calculus exam?

We accept a score of 3 or higher on the AP Pre-Calculus exam for credit in Pre-Calculus, so you are qualified to take Calculus I without need for the placement exam.

#### What if I have taken the AP Calculus exam?

We award Calculus I credit for a score of 4 or 5 on the AP Calculus AB exam, AP Calculus BC exam, or AB subscore of the AP Calculus BC exam. You will not take Calculus I at Benedictine College, so you do not need to take the placement exam. Note: for a score of 4 or 5 on the overall score of an AP Calculus BC exam, we also award Calculus II (MATH-1350) credit.

#### What major programs require Calculus I?

Astronomy, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Chemical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Engineering Physics, Mechanical Engineering, Mathematics, Mathematics with Secondary School Teaching Certification (Math Ed), and Physics require Calculus I.

#### I plan to major in Engineering, Mathematics, Math Ed, or Physics; is there any special advice for me?

You are encouraged to take the exam as soon as it is available, so that, if you do not pass, you may consider finding a Pre-Calculus class over the summer to transfer to Benedictine in order to enroll in Calculus I in the fall semester. Taking Calculus I in your first semester will help you avoid unnecessary delays in graduation.

#### I passed Pre-Calculus in high school. Do I need to take the exam?

Yes, high school level Pre-Calculus does not fulfill the pre-requisite curriculum to take Calculus I. High school Pre-Calculus curriculum is unregulated and varies drastically from school to school. Unfortunately, many students who earn a grade of 'A' in high school Pre-Calculus are under prepared for Calculus at the college level.

#### I took Pre-Calculus for college credit at another college/university. Do I need to take the exam?

You do not need to take the exam if you earned a grade of 'C' or better in an equivalent Pre-Calculus course at another college or university. The successful completion of an equivalent Pre-Calculus through dual credit, PSEO, or similar programs is also sufficient.

#### When is the Calculus I Placement Exam offered?

The exam is available online June 1–July 25. In addition, we have reserved time at each SOAR Weekend (May 31-June 1 and June 7-8) to take the placement exam. You will receive instructions on the time and location when you arrive for SOAR.

#### How do I take the online Calculus Placement Exam?

You will receive a detailed email on June 1 with instructions on how to access and take the exam.

#### Is there a cost associated with the exam?

No. The exam is offered at no charge to the student.

#### Is there a deadline to take the exam?

The deadline to take the exam and still be placed in Calculus I in the fall semester is July 25. We strongly encourage you take the exam as early as possible.

#### What is the exam format?

The 70-minute exam is timed; you cannot pause it. Calculators are not allowed.

#### How do I prepare for the exam?

It is designed to test students without preparation, so there is no need to study for it.

#### When will I know my results?

Upon completion of the exam, your screen will indicate whether you passed or failed. This is the only notification you will receive. The Director of Calculus Placement will also receive a record of your result.

#### May I retake the exam if I do not pass?

No. The results of the placement exam are final.

#### What class will I be placed in if I do not pass the exam or do not take the exam?

Pending course availability, you will be placed in Pre-Calculus.

#### Who should I contact regarding questions about the **Calculus I Placement Exam?**

#### What is the foreign language requirement at **Benedictine?**

The language requirement component of the core curriculum is proficiency through the second semester of a foreign language. The language requirement can be fulfilled through the placement exam, with AP credits, dual enrollment, or by taking courses at Benedictine. For students who have studied other languages at the college level, those courses will be evaluated for transfer. Benedictine College offers first-year French, Spanish, Latin, and Greek. Students may also take Italian through the Florence program.

#### Why does Benedictine require the language placement exam?

Benedictine College has a core two-semester foreign language requirement. We require the language placement exam in order to assure that you are placed at the appropriate course level.



## Foreign Language Placement Exam

#### Who needs to take the placement exam?

Students who have completed three or more years of a language in high school are required to take the language placement exam before taking a course in the same language. If you do not intend to continue studying the same language, the exam is optional. Students who received dual enrollment credit, AP credit, or transferred in college credit are not required to take the exam, but may take it if they want to continue studying the language and be assured of proper placement.

#### When is the language placement exam offered?

Placement exams are offered on both SOAR weekends and prior to the start of the fall and spring semesters. All dates are listed in the Academic Calendar. Exams are offered in Spanish, French, and Latin and take 20-60 minutes. Students receive their exam results immediately for French and Spanish. Latin results are usually available within a week.

#### How does placement work?

Any student who has taken three years of a language in high school must take the placement exam before enrolling in a course in the same language. If you place out of the course, your schedule will be adjusted accordingly to reflect the appropriate course level (e.g. SPAN-1020, 2010 or beyond).

#### What if I am placed into 1020 but am afraid it will be too difficult and want to take 1000?

This is not an option. Our placement guidelines are very carefully established. If you are placed into a second-semester level, you will be more than adequately prepared for succeeding in this course. If you enroll in 1000, you will be dropped from the course. If you are truly concerned that 1020 will be too difficult, the class (with instructor approval and space providing), but you may not take 1000 for a grade.

#### When should I take my foreign language courses?

We recommend completing your language requirement early in your college career. Be sure to consult with your academic advisor.
